## CHALLENGES

Create a fact file about a real-life hero (past or present) that you find interesting.



Collect clippings and stories from newspapers & magazines about real-life heroes. Make a clippings board. Heroic acts might be saving people or animals, fighting fires or donating organs to help another person.



Find an example of a comic book cartoon that involves heroes and villains. Draw your own hero and villain in the same style. How will you show who is good and who is evil?

Make a Top Trumps card game for heroes and villains. Include name, picture and a short description of each character. Include their strengths, weaknesses,



intelligence, fitness and any other fun facts to gain them points.
