This may be the death of someone significant, the birth of a sibling or a key family event. They can use whatever materials they wish to make their poppy and it can be any size they wish (within reason). We will use these poppies and pieces of writing to add to our display of remembrance so please make sure they are your best effort. Please could these be brought back into school by **Friday 9th November.**

CHALLENGES

Choose a popular song that you can't stop singing! Can you change one of the lines of the song ensuring it has the same amount of syllables as before you changed it? Be ready to share this with the class.

Use the internet to find out about instruments from around the world. Can you print or draw a picture of an instrument and tell us about it?



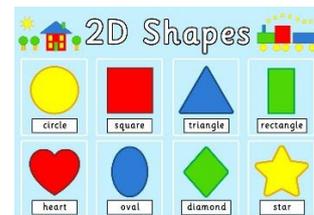
Watch online footage of brass bands. Create a musical band at home with family or friends, improvising with instruments to achieve different sounds.
