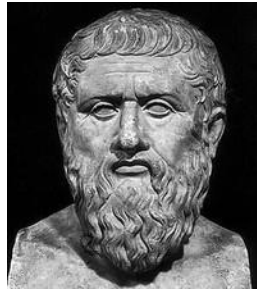
CHALLENGES

Make a scrapbook using downloaded images and drawings and write informative sentences and captions.

Write a food review describing what you have eaten.



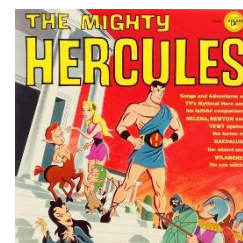
