



## Summary Information

For the year 2015-2016 our school received £3,523 Sports Funding and this year, 2016-2017, we will receive £8,515 in two instalments.

## Sports Funding expenditure

- To employ specialist coaches to work alongside staff, for example, multi skills, tag rugby, football, dodge ball etc.
- Employ staff to run inter school games to increase participation in competitive sports.
- To buy resources to ensure there is a range of activities and skills that the children can participate in, both during lessons and at playtimes.
- To establish strong links with local cluster schools and within the HAT to provide joint sports activities across the school.
- Pay for transport to inter-sport events.
- To provide specialist enrichment sports weeks to inspire and enrich sporting, such as the climbing wall.
- To provide extra curricular opportunities for children, such as 'run a mile' club.
- To employ a member of staff to be a Sports Champion and represent St. James' within the HAT to enrich the sporting opportunities for our children.

## Impact and Evaluation of expenditure

- Children took part in many inter school and intra school competitions last year including tag rugby, dancing, football and swimming. This enrichment to beyond their usual PE curriculum encouraged them to think wholly about teamwork, communication and provided the

element of competition. All year groups got the opportunity to take part in a competitive event at some stage through the year.

- Outside coaches provided some specialist sports teaching which gave the children specialist provision as well as enhancing the staff's knowledge across the PE curriculum.
- Staff ran various sports clubs through the year, offering enriched activities for all children, there was a higher uptake in sports clubs due to the variety of activities offered.
- We achieved our 'School Games' Gold award due to the level and range of sports provision we offered the children last year.
